



### MAX BARKER



Max Barker began dancing at age five at the ABT Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis School and has performed for many seasons with American Ballet Theatre at the Metropolitan Opera House in New York City. He trained at the ABT JKO School for nine years and participated in the Prix de Lausanne in 2020, placing as a Finalist. Continuing his training, Barker privately worked at the Fabrice Herrault Studio for two years, after which he joined The Royal Ballet School in London. In 2023, he performed on The Royal Opera House stage with The Royal Ballet

School and in *Yondering* for John Neumierer's 50th Anniversary with the Hamburg Ballet. Barker joined ABT Studio Company in September 2023 under the artistic direction of Sascha Radetsky. In ABT Studio Company, he has created roles in ballets by Amy Hall Garner and Houston Thomas and performed in new ballets by Jamar Roberts, Lauren Lovette, James Whiteside, and Brady Farrar. Barker's ABT Studio Company repertoire also includes the principal role "Country Gardens" from Twyla Tharp's *Brief Fling*, pas de deux from *Diana and Acteon* and Gerald Arpino's *Birthday Variations*, the Black Swan pas de deux and Neapolitan Dance from *Swan Lake*, Jerome Robbins' *Interplay*, and George Balanchine's *Tarantella*. He has performed in Alexei Ratmansky's *The Nutcracker* with the main Company of American Ballet Theatre.


# MAXIMILIAN CATAZARO



Maximilian Catazaro was born in Canton, Ohio and began his dance training at The School of Canton Ballet under the tutelage of Cassandra Crowley and his mother Jennifer Catazaro Hayward. In 2022, he began training at Miami City Ballet School in Miami, Florida on full scholarship. While at Miami City Ballet, Catazaro danced featured roles in George Balanchine's *Four Temperaments* and had the opportunity to perform with Miami City Ballet in John Cranko's *Romeo* 

and Juliet. In May of 2022, he was named the Eleanor Pao Scholar at Miami City Ballet School. In the summer of 2023, Catazaro was accepted to the American Ballet Theatre Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis School on a full scholarship. He joined ABT Studio Company in September 2024 under the artistic direction of Sascha Radetsky. In ABT Studio Company, Catazaro has performed in new ballets by Houston Thomas, Amy Hall Garner, and Brady Farrar, and his repertoire also includes Gerald Arpino's Birthday Variations pas de deux and Jerome Robbins' Interplay. He has performed in Alexei Ratmansky's The Nutcracker with the main Company of American Ballet Theatre.

### YEONSEO CHOI



YeonSeo Choi was born in Seoul, Korea. She started dancing ballet at age six and began her serious ballet training at age 10 at Mechowlah Art Center, under the coaching of JoonHa Kang. She went on to win several gold medal awards and scholarships in Korea's top competitions. Choi was a Finalist at the Prix de Lausanne in 2022 and was offered a full scholarship to the ABT Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis School. After participating in the ABT New York Summer Intensive in Summer 2022, she was invited to join ABT Studio Company in

September 2022 under the artistic direction of Sascha Radetsky. In ABT Studio Company, she has created roles in ballets by Gemma Bond, Houston Thomas, and James Whiteside and performed in new ballets by Hope Boykin, Amy Hall Garner, Lauren Lovette, Madison Brown, and Brady Farrar. Choi's repertoire with ABT Studio Company also includes pas de deux from *Paquita, Raymonda,* Alexei Ratmansky's *The Seasons,* Gerald Arpino's *Birthday Variations,* and *Diana and Acteon,* the Black Swan pas de deux from *Swan Lake,* Jerome Robbins' *Interplay,* and the Rose Adagio from *The Sleeping Beauty.* She has performed in Alexei Ratmansky's *The Nutcracker* with the main Company of American Ballet Theatre.

### **ELIJAH GFOLINA**



Elijah Geolina discovered his passion for dance at the age of eight when he stumbled into a Latin Ballroom class in which a little girl needed a dance partner. Geolina danced for Champion Ballroom Academy in San Diego, California with coach Olga Ginzburg for six years and holds Latin Ballroom Championship titles in Southern California and in Las Vegas, Nevada. Geolina has been featured on the shows *So You Think You Can Dance Kids* on Fox and *Little Big Shots* on NBC. At the age of 14, Geolina switched his

focus to ballet. After three years of training with Raul and Cindy Salamanca at Golden State Ballet Academy, he earned a scholarship to the ABT Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis School, where he trained for a year under Stella Abrera's direction. Geolina joined ABT Studio Company in September 2023 under the artistic direction of Sascha Radetsky. In ABT Studio Company, he has created roles in ballets by Amy Hall Garner, James Whiteside, and Houston Thomas and performed in new ballets by Jamar Roberts, Hope Boykin, Brady Farrar, and Lauren Lovette. Geolina's repertoire with ABT Studio Company also includes the Neapolitan dance from *Swan Lake*, Alexei Ratmansky's *The Seasons* pas de deux, *Human* by Yannick Lebrun, Jerome Robbins' *Interplay*, and George Balanchine's *Tarantella*. ### PTOLEMY GIDNEY



Ptolemy Gidney began dancing at the age of 5 at The Kilburn School of Dance in Wellingborough, United Kingdom. At the age of ten, he appeared in London's West End musicals which included the lead as Charlie (*Charlie in the Chocolate Factory The* Musical) and Bruce (*Matilda The Musical*). Following his time in the West End, Ptolemy joined The Royal Ballet School White Lodge where he trained for five years. While in White Lodge, he appeared in roles such as Fritz in Royal Ballet's *The Nutcracker* and William Frankenstein in *Frankenstein* by

Liam Scarlet. Additionally, he received the April Olrich award in his final year of training at White Lodge. Gidney continued his training at The Royal Ballet Upper School for 3 years where he performed in works such as the lead in Bournonville's *Konservatoriet*, Goyo Montero's *BOLD* and Mikaela Polley's *fast blue*. In his second year at the School, Gidney won 3rd prize in The Royal Ballet School's Lynn Seymour Awards, performing an excerpt from *Creature* by Abram Khan, and he later performed in Gemma Bond's *assemblage* and Josh Junker's *Remembrance*. Gidney joined ABT Studio Company in February 2025 under the artistic direction of Sascha Radetsky.

### **DANIEL GUZMÁN**



Daniel Guzmán began his training in Isle de Margarita, Venezuela under the direction of Martha Gomez, Artistic Director of Ballet de la Mar. He won numerous competitions in Venezuela and after graduation from Ballet de la Mar, Guzmán moved to the United States to continue his training. He was the gold medalist at the Youth America Grand Prix 2023 Finals, winning many scholarships nationally. He was also the 2023 Grand Prix Winner at the Universal Ballet Competition. Guzmán joined ABT Studio Company in January 2024 under the artistic direction of

Sascha Radetsky. In ABT Studio Company, Guzmán created a role in *Young & Beautiful* by James Whiteside and has performed in new ballets by Houston Thomas, Amy Hall Garner, Madison Brown, and Brady Farrar. Guzmán's other repertoire with ABT Studio Company includes the Neapolitan Dance from *Swan Lake*, George Balanchine's *Tarantella, Human* by Yannick Lebrun, and pas de deux from *Diana and Acteon, Don Quixote*, and Gerald Arpino's *Birthday Variations*. # PALOMA LIVELLARA



Paloma Livellara was born in Mendoza, Argentina. She discovered her interest in dance in Buenos Aires at the age of three after unintentionally passing by a ballet class, sparking a passion that has never faded. She initially trained in a variety of styles, deciding to focus on ballet at the age of eight when she auditioned for the Teatro Colon Ballet School. Throughout her ballet training, she had the pleasure of working with teacher Barbara Yacovone, who helped her grow until she left Argentina to study abroad. Livellara has been a Youth America

Grand Prix Finalist three times. In 2019, she accepted a full scholarship from Luca Masala, director of the Académie de Danse Princesse Grace in Monaco, where she spent five valuable years. In February of 2024, she competed at the Prix de Lausanne, placing as a Finalist, Prize Winner, and winner of two additional prizes. Livellara joined ABT Studio Company in September 2024 under the artistic direction of Sascha Radetsky. In ABT Studio Company, she created a role in *U Don't Know Me* by Houston Thomas and has performed in new ballets by Amy Hall Garner and Brady Farrar. 
### KAYLA MAK

# VIKTORIA PAPAKALODOUKA



Viktoria Papakalodouka, originally from Athens, Greece, took her first ballet class before turning 5 years old. At age 9, her family moved to New York City to pursue her ballet training. She began training at Ballet Academy East, joined the ABT Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis School, and later joined Ellison Ballet's Professional Training Program. Later that year, she

participated in the Youth America Grand Prix 25th Anniversary Finals in which she won the Natalia Makarova Award for Artistry. Papakalodouka also performed in numerous YAGP galas between 2023 and 2024. In fall 2024, she returned to the ABT JKO School in the Upper 3 level and had the opportunity to perform in Alexei Ratmansky's *The Nutcracker* with the main Company of American Ballet Theatre. She joined ABT Studio Company in January 2025 under the artistic direction of Sascha Radetsky. 
